Student Teachers

We would like to welcome our six student teachers who will be joining our school team from November 10 through to December 5. The Grade 3, 4 and 5 classes are excited to have them in their classrooms.

Cancellation of Bussing

Our transportation system has an excellent record for service. However, given the possible extremes of Edmonton weather and the potential for unexpected mechanical difficulties, it is impossible to guarantee buses will run on time or at all. A route can take 50% longer in adverse weather conditions. Parents are advised that if a bus does not arrive within twenty minutes of its scheduled time, they are to assume the bus is not coming. Parents must ensure that their child knows to return home or to a pre-selected location and the parents must make alternate arrangements to get their child to school.

Parents should also ensure that:

- ◆ children are supervised at the bus stop
- ◆ children have a place to go in the event the bus does not arrive
- ◆ children have alternate arrangements for getting to school should the bus not arrive
- ◆ children are suitably clothed to withstand weather extremes

Cold Weather Policy

As we move closer to the winter season and the colder weather, we would like to communicate the following guidelines to you:

- * **Extreme weather conditions** are when air temperature and wind-chill factors are below -20 degrees C. At this temperature, unprotected skin can freeze in one minute.
- * Students will have recess indoors only during extreme weather conditions.
- * Entry doors are unlocked in the morning, and students may enter if conditions are extreme.
- * AMA Crossing Patrols will **NOT** be out in extreme conditions.
- * Students should come to school dressed appropriately to be outside (winter coat, snow pants, winter boots, toque, scarf, and warm winter gloves).

To schedule a 15 minute conference time with your child's teacher please call the school office at 780-479-5847. We will be accepting conference bookings as of Friday, November 21st.

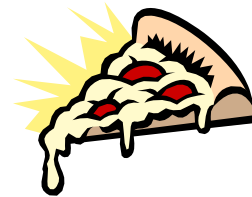
It is our hope that by providing Conference times in the afternoon and evening, we can accommodate everyone's schedule to encourage 100% parental attendance! Parents play a key role in assisting and encouraging children to develop good work habits. Checking your child's progress via homework, written and graded assignments, oral reading and various projects will help to give you an idea of your child's progress and commitment to their school work.

Microwave Use

Each classroom is equipped with a microwave oven for the purpose of heating/warming the children's lunches. In an effort to ensure that all the children within the class are able to warm up their lunch it is important to provide them with lunch items which only require a 30-60 second warm up. Lunch items which require any more than 60 seconds take up a large part of the lunch period and do not allow all students to have access to the microwave oven. Please send only items which require no more than 60 seconds and try to limit the number of lunches which require a warm up during the week. In addition, to assist our lunch monitors in heating up the lunches, please indicate the amount of time, in seconds, that your child's lunch requires heating.

Hot Lunch

We will be beginning our monthly hot lunch program this month. Our 1st hot lunch will be on Friday, November 28th and it will be a pizza hot lunch. Hot lunch order forms will be sent out later this month.



Rodeo Week

The Canadian Finals Rodeo begins on November 5th and ends on November 8th. In recognition of this event we will be having a "be seen in jeans" week where the students and staff are encouraged to wear jeans during November 3-7 along with their white school uniform tops. To culminate this week we will be having a "Western Day" whereby the students can dress up in western wear (jeans, western shirt, and cowboy hat). Please note that no weapons/toy guns will be allowed.



Head Lice

As mentioned in our October newsletter, it is not uncommon to have incidents of head lice in the school setting. It is important to check your children regularly and report any incident of head lice to our office staff. Incidents are kept in the strictest confidence.

Advent: a Time of Preparation and Prayer

Advent, part of a joyous celebration that includes both Christmas and Epiphany, begins on Sunday, November 30th. It is a season of joyful hope and spiritual expectation; a time for preparation, prayer and generosity. Advent is a time of excitement, wonder, joy, and anticipation as well as an attentiveness to get things into order for Christmas. Like the excitement of awaiting the birth of a child, much preparation and anticipation awaits the joyful day. Just as the focal point for parents is the birth of their child, the focal point of the Christmas season for Christians is God becoming one of us in Jesus. During Advent and Christmas, we retell the story of Jesus' coming. God wanted to show us the depth of divine love so God sent us Jesus. Jesus entered into our humanity to bring us salvation, healing, and joy. In Jesus, God has come among us. The season draws to a close on Epiphany, January 6th; the Three Wise Men symbolize the whole human family for whom Christ was born.

Just as parents savour the anticipated birth of their child, we don't want to rush into the customs of Christmas before we savour the rituals connected to Advent. There are many customs and traditions that help us in this waiting period for Christmas. Advent calendars, songs such as "O Come, O Come Emmanuel, setting out an empty stable (creche) are some signs of preparation for the coming of Jesus. The Advent wreath is another tradition that gathers the family in a prayerful setting to reflect on the gifts that God had given us.

The traditional Advent wreath consists of evergreen branches formed into a circle with four candles representing the four weeks of Advent. The circular wreath is a sign of God's eternal love for us. The evergreen branches suggest the faithfulness of God, which is always alive and fresh. The four candles (three purple and one pink) represent the four weeks before Christmas.

The pink candle is lit on the third week as a symbol of rejoicing. Each week, as we light additional candles, the light gradually increases as we move closer to the coming of the Lord, the Light of the World.

A prayer to share with your family

O God,

As light comes from this candle,

May the blessings of Jesus Christ come to us,

Warming our hearts and brightening our way.

May Christ the Saviour bring life

Into the darkness of this world.

Lord Jesus, fill us with your love, make us joyful in faith and hope and keep us safe in your love.

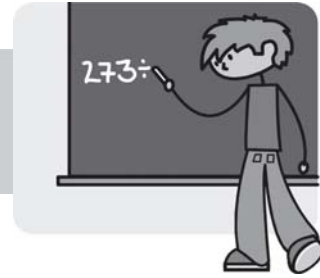

Parent/Teacher Newsletter

Helping Hands/Attention and Focus

SHIP Occupational Therapists provide ideas to improve the fit between a student and the tasks they do at home and school. A good match can increase a child's belief in their abilities and help them have success on tasks they feel are important. This month's newsletter is about attention and focus.

Your child is already paying attention! The question is what are they paying attention to? They are often aware of the things that are most interesting to them. Are they watching the other kids in the class? Noticing what the dog is doing while you're talking to them?

Work on helping your child channel their interest and energy into school or homework. Children also benefit from activities to keep their body awake and able to focus.

Body Breaks:

Movement: often a five minute break is all that is needed.

- Sing songs with movement – "Head and Shoulders," "I'm a little Teapot."
- Heavy work breaks – Lift and move desks around for different class activities. Carry books/supplies from one room to another. Have students carry 2L bottles (filled with sparkly water) from one room to another.
- Desk Exercises – Push palms together (fingers pointed up) for a few seconds, relax and repeat. Hook fingers together and try to pull hands apart. Try some chair push ups. Move mouth/face in all different directions.

Put Something in Your Mouth: alerting foods tend to be cold, sour/tart, spicy, minty, or crunchy. Calming foods tend to be warm, smooth or sweet.

- **Chew:** stir sticks, popsicle sticks or straws. Chewy and crunchy food as snacks, like beef jerky, fruit roll-ups, apples, carrots and even gum.
- **Suck:** using a straw or 'exercise bottle', hard candy.
- **Blow:** Blow through a party favor, whistle, balloon, bubbles through a straw. Breathe slow, deep breaths in through the nose and out through the mouth.

Hand Fidgets: Adults fidget with their keys, paper clips, and even their hair! Fidgets can also help children pay attention.

- Hand tool ideas: koosh balls, paper clips, rubber bands, straws, putty, or a coiled shoelace.

More Helpful Ideas

- Use their interests: If your child loves cars, try to find a book about cars to encourage more focus when reading.
- Quiet time: The 'busy level' of your home life will affect your child's attention span. Make time for quiet activities. Read a book or make a puzzle as a family.
- Limit television and computerized games: T.V. and video games are made for short attention spans.

Capital Health News

Outbreaks of influenza occur in Canada annually during the fall and winter months resulting in an increase in absenteeism in schools and workplaces. Influenza immunization is a safe and effective strategy to prevent illness and is recommended for all individuals who have chronic health conditions, such as:

- Heart or lung conditions (e.g., asthma)
- Diabetes and other metabolic conditions
- Cancer, kidney disease, anemia, and immune disorders
- Long-term ASA (aspirin) therapy recipients (children and adolescents up to 18 years)

Individuals with chronic health conditions are at an increased risk of influenza-related complications which may lead to an exacerbation of their condition.

Alberta Health Services - Capital Health offers free influenza immunization to children with chronic health conditions and all their household members.

The publicly-funded Influenza Immunization Program also includes children under the age of 23 months and their caregivers as well as children 24 months up to and including 4 years of age. Adults 50 and older also qualify for the influenza immunization free of charge (see attached).

The most effective way to protect yourself from influenza is to get an immunization every year. The influenza immunization can be purchased for \$25 for those not eligible for free immunization.

Drop-in influenza immunization clinics will be held at designated community sites in the region beginning on Monday, October 20th, 2008.

We are asking for your support to relay this message to your students, staff and parents by e-mailing the attached information to your school principals so it may be included in all October/November school newsletters.

Attention St. Jerome Parents!

We, the parents at St. Jerome have the opportunity to support our school through a unique fundraising program. All that you have to do is look through the order form and see which businesses you use on a regular basis. Then you purchase some gift cards for those retailers and shop there like you normally would anyway.

It costs you **no more** to buy these cards than what you would normally spend at these retailers. For example a \$20 gift card costs you \$20. So in other words, you spend the same amount you would normally spend but St. Jerome's will benefit by receiving a percentage from the gift cards you purchase. Here are two examples:

☺ *You purchase \$200.00 worth of Safeway gift cards. This costs you \$200. St. Jerome receives 3% of your purchase which is \$6. You then use these the next time you go for groceries instead of cash. You then receive \$200 worth of groceries.*

☺ *You need to buy a gift (Christmas, birthday, or wedding) for someone who is difficult to buy for. You purchase a \$100 gift card from Home Depot for \$100.*

St. Jerome receives 2% of your purchase which is \$2. You give this gift card to them as your gift. They then use it and receive \$100 worth of tools.

There is no markup on these cards so it basically **does not cost you anything** to use this program yet our school will greatly benefit. We will have orders going in every month and these small percentages will add up very quickly. In the Safeway example above, if you did this every month for the school year, your family alone would raise \$60. So far we have done 4 orders and already raised over \$300 pure profit for the school. Once we get used to this program it will be amazing how much we can benefit our children with the funds we raise.

Please take a moment to look at the attached order form to see the numerous retailers you can buy gift cards for. You can get anything and everything from gas, groceries, movies, and clothing to coffee.

If we all work together this can be a very inexpensive and successful way for all of us to support our children at St. Jerome Science Academy!
